# **COS1010 Personal Images**

 Develop an increased appreciation for the significance of personal grooming in various life situations and gain the knowledge and skills required to perform grooming practices. Learn how "image" is an important form of communication. Skin care, nail care, hair care and modern trends are all addressed in the hands-on activities for this module. This is the foundation module for all Cosmetology courses.

# **HSA3430 Hairstyling I**

• Develop basic hairstyling skills, including sectioning, parting, wet setting, thermal styling and style finishing. Enjoy learning to use a wide range of hot tools and styling products. Theoretical focus is on decontamination and infection control.

#### HSA3400 Hair & Scalp Care I

• Learn the fundamentals of healthy hair and scalp, maintenance and correction treatments. Includes cleansing and conditioning, scalp treatments, and hair treatments. Theoretical focus includes histology of hair & scalp, analysis, and selection of suitable products for different hair types and conditions.

#### EST1070 Manicure I

• Students identify the functions, shapes and basic structure of fingernails, identify conditions of the hands and fingernails, and perform basic manicures.

# EST1020 Introductory Skin Care

• Students identify the basic structures and functions of the skin. Students will perform a basic facial including cleansing, toning and nourishing.

# EST2050 Make-up

• Students analyze facial shapes and features and will perform a full service make-up technique.

# **COS1020 Long Hair Design**

• Students will learn how to design trendy braids such as: Roping, knotting and braiding.
